



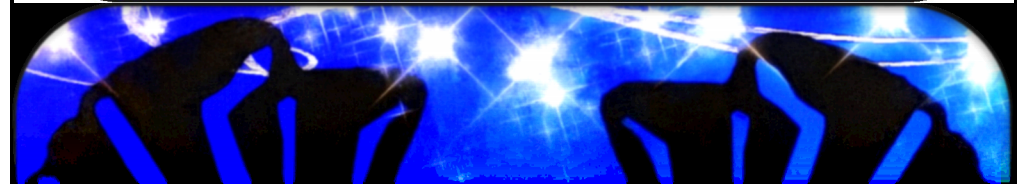

About this Service of Lessons and Carols

The Festival of Lessons and Carols is a popular 20th century Christmas tradition celebrated around the world. First created in 1880 by Edward Benson, who later became the Archbishop of Canterbury, it was adapted and made famous by the choir of the Chapel of King's College, Cambridge, UK, which first performed it on Christmas Eve, 1918. It continues to be adapted and performed by symphonies, colleges, parishes, and cathedral churches throughout the world.

Our Christ Church Aspen adaptation includes seven lessons from Holy Scripture. We begin with the Genesis story of the Fall of Adam and Eve, we trace the Hebrew prophecies of the Messiah, and then tell the story of the Nativity of Christ. The music includes choir anthems, and familiar carols sung by the congregation. The words to the carols are printed in this service booklet and are sung to the traditional tunes.

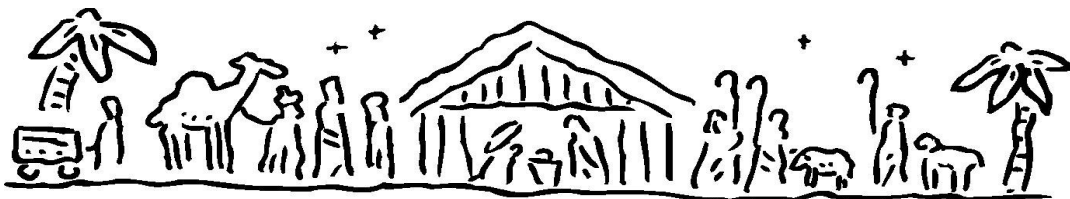
